expert, *m.* connoisseur, judge, expert; **ser** — **de** to be judge of.

conocer¹⁵ [kon-ose-r] *v.* irr. (*tener idea de*) to know, be acquainted with; to recognize; (*llamar a conocer*) to meet; **se conoce que** it is clear or evident that.

conocido [kon-osi-do] *p. p.* & *adj.* known; well-known; *m.* acquaintance.

conocimiento [kon-osi-mjén-to] *m.* (inteligencia) knowledge, understanding; acquaintance; (afirmación) bill of lading, -a knowledge, learning; **poner en** — to inform.

conque [kón-ke] *conj.* so then, well then, and so.

conquista [kon-kwí-sta] *f.* conquest.

conquistador [kon-kwí-stá-dór] *m.* conqueror; *adj.*

conquering, victorious.

conquistar [kon-kwí-stár] *v.* to conquer, defeat; to win.

constatado [kon-sa-tá-do] *adj.* aforementioned, aforesaid.

consecración [kon-sa-grá-sjón] *f.* consecration.

consagrar [kon-sa-grár] *v.* to consecrate.

consciencia [kon-sjén-sja] *f.* consciousness.

consciente [kon-sjén-te] *adj.* conscious.

consecución [kon-se-kusjón] *f.* attainment.

consecuencia [kon-se-kwén-sja] *f.* consequence; result; **a** — **de** as a result of; **por** (or **en**) — therefore; consequently.

consecuente [kon-se-kwén-te] *adj.* consequent,

logical; consistent; *m.* consequence, result.

consecutivo [kon-se-kutí-bo] *adj.* consecutive,

successive.

conseguir^{17, 18} [kon-se-gír] *v.* irr. to get, obtain; to reach, attain.

conseja [kon-sé-ja] *f.* old wives' tale, fable.

consejero [kon-se-sé-ro] *m.* adviser, counselor.

consentimiento [kon-sen-timjén-to] *m.* consent.

conservación [kon-ser-ba-sjón] *f.* conservation.

conservador [kon-ser-bá-dór] *m.* conservative;

preserver; guardian; *adj.* conservative.

conservar [kon-ser-bár] *v.* to conserve, keep; to preserve.

considerable [kon-si-derá-ble] *adj.* considerable.

consideración [kon-si-dera-sjón] *f.* consideration.

considerado [kon-si-dera-do] *adj.* considerate, thoughtful, respected, prudent.

considerar [kon-si-dera-r] *v.* to consider; to treat with consideration.

consigna [kon-si-gna] *f.* watchword, password; *Am.* checkroom.

consignar [kon-si-gnár] *v.* to consign; to deliver; to deposit; to assign; (*facturar*) to check (baggage).

consigo [kon-si-go] *v.* to associate, with himself (herself, themselves).

consiguiente [kon-si-gjén-te] *adj.* consequent; *m.* consequence; **por** — consequently.

consistente [kon-sistén-te] *adj.* firm, substantial.

constituir [kon-sistír] *v.* to constitute; to be based on; ¿en qué consiste? of what does it consist?

compañero [kon-só-jo] *m.* associate, partner.

consola [kon-só-la] *f.* console.

consolación [kon-so-lá-sjón] *f.* consolation.

consolar²⁰ [kon-so-lár] *v.* irr. to console, cheer.

conspiración [kon-spi-rá-sjón] *f.* conspiracy, plot.

conspirar [kon-spi-rár] *v.* to conspire, plot.

constancia [kon-stán-sja] *f.* (firmeza) constancy;

perseverance; (certeza) evidence, certainty; *Am.* documentary proof, record.

constante [kon-stá-n-te] *adj.* constant, continual; (fiel) firm, faithful.

constar [kon-stár] *v.* to be evident, clear; (*constar en*) to consist (of), be composed (of); to be on record.

constatación [kon-sta-tá-sjón] *f.* *Am.* proof, check, evidence.

constelación [kon-ste-lá-sjón] *f.* constellation.

constipado [kon-sití-pá-do] *adj.* suffering from a cold *m.* cold in the head.

constipar [kon-sití-pár] *v.* to stop up (the nasal passages); to cause a cold; -**se** to catch cold.

constitución [kon-titú-sjón] *f.* constitution.

constitucional [kon-stitú-sjónal] *adj.* constitutional.

constituir²¹ [kon-stitú-ír] *v.* irr. to constitute, form to set up, establish; -**se en** to set oneself up as.

constitutivo [kon-stitú-tí-bo] = **constituyente**.

constituyente [kon-stitú-yén-te] *adj.* constituent.
